

Public Disclosures Regarding HEERF Funds (Student Portion)

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Santa Ana Beauty College (SABC) signed and returned the first Certification and Agreement of the Student Aid and Institutional Portions of the CARES Act funds to the U.S. Department of Education on June 15, 2020. SABC received its allocation on June 25th, 2020.

SABC intends to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

The amount of funds dedicated to student aid is \$85,506

- As of July 25th, 2020 (30 days from allocation of CARES Act funds), SABC had distributed \$ 43,990 to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of Sept 10th, 2020 (45 days from the last update), SABC had distributed \$ 1660 to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of Oct 25th, 2020 (45 days from the last update), SABC had distributed \$0 to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of December 31, 2020, UCB had distributed \$0 to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of April 30th 2021, SABC had distributed \$ 37,056 to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act
- As of June 20th 2021, SABC had distributed the remaining balance to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES A

The estimated total number of students eligible to receive grant in 2020 is 115.

- As of July 25th, 2020 (30 days from allocation of CARES Act funds), 39 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

- As of September 10th, 2020 (45 days from the most recent update), 43 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of Oct 25th, 2020, (45 days from the most recent update) 55 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of December 31, 2020, 55 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of April 30th, 2021, 49 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- As of Jun 30th, 2021, 70 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

Students were deemed eligible to receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant if they had completed their FAFSA and were eligible for Title IV and if they were enrolled in a course that extended past March 13, 2020 and/or if they were enrolled in a Summer 2020 course. Those students who had not previously completed a FAFSA (e.g., students who had only been enrolled in a contract course) are able to contact Financial Aid office to confirm whether that student is eligible. Full time students are eligible for \$830 equally, and part time student are eligible for \$500 equally.
